



Oregano - Greek

Plant oregano in light, well drained soil in full sun. Don't overwater this herb; water thoroughly but only when the soil is drive to the touch. There is any need to fertilise this plant. Oregano works as a good companion plant to tomatoes and peppers. Harvest oregano once the stems are at least 10cm tall. Regular trimming encourages new growth. Leaves can be dried for later use by tying stems in bundles and hanging them upside down in a paper bag with a few holes punched in to allow for airflow. This is a slightly spicy herb with an earthy flavour and used commonly as a seasoning for pizza, sauces, meats and salads.
