



Rosemary

Rosemary prefers a poor, slightly alkaline soil. Dig some lime into your soil, but don't add compost or manure. Make sure the soil drains well to prevent water-logging.

Rosemary doesn't like too much water and only needs fertilising once a year. It doesn't need mulching, but you can cover the soil with stones or pebbles instead.

Gently prune and shape your rosemary bush in Winter to maintain an attractive shape.

Rosemary can be harvested all year round, and is a great addition to soups, casseroles, salads and stews. It goes well with all meat and fish, as well as with potatoes, mushrooms and grains.
